CONFIDENT	<b>Finds God's words, commands, and promises a firm foundation for living – Isa. 32:17, Prov. 3:21-26</b> (Insecure – focuses on own strength – calls on God only in emergencies)	
CONTENT	<b>Is happy with what he/she has – 1 Tim. 6:6</b> (Dissatisfied – wants more, especially what his/her friends have)	
MEEK	<b>Accepts circumstances with quietness – Titus 3:2</b> (Anger – is unhappy when things don't go his/her own way)	
JOYFUL	<b>Is happy inside and out – Phil. 4:4</b> (Unhappy – may try to look happy to the world, but isn't inside)	
HUMBLE	<b>Realizes his successes have come from help he/she receives from others – Prov. 16:18-19, 1 Peter 5:5b-6</b> (Arrogant and prideful)	

**Relationships With Others:**

FRIENDLY	<b>Eagerly shares himself/herself with others – Prov. 18:24a</b> (Unsociable – finds it difficult to make friends, feels others don't like him/her)	
KIND	<b>Has gentle words and ways – Eph. 4:32, Phil. 4:5</b> (Meanness – does or says things that hurt others' feelings)	
TENDERHEARTED	<b>Feels the hurts of others and tries to help – Eph. 4:32, Col. 3:12</b> (Uncaring – doesn't notice the difficulties of others)	
RESPECTFUL	<b>Recognizes the worth or authority of others – 1 Thes. 5:12-13</b> (Sassy – tries to show by action or attitude that he/she is better than others)	
GENEROUS	<b>Shares with a happy spirit – 2 Cor. 9:7</b> (Selfish – shares grudgingly, if at all)	
FAIR	<b>Treats others equally – Luke 6:31, James 2:1-4, 9</b> (Favoritism – treats some better than others, making others feel mistreated)	
ACCEPTING	<b>Easily shares himself/herself with others, even if they are different – Acts 10:34-35</b> (Prejudice – rejects others on a superficial basis)	

**CHARACTER TRAIT****DEFINITION****RESULTS****Actions Towards Others:**

FORGIVING	<b>Treats another as though that person had not hurt him/her – Col. 3:13, 1 Thes. 5:15</b> (Revenge – bears grudges, tries to get even for real or imagined hurts)	
PATIENT	<b>Waits with a happy spirit – James 5:8, Gal. 5:22, Phil. 4:6</b> (Fretfulness – wants things immediately)	
THANKFUL	<b>Is grateful to others and says so – 1 Thes. 5:18</b> (Ingratitude – is ungrateful, or doesn't express appreciation to others)	
HELPFUL	<b>Is ready to serve others – Isa. 41:6a</b> (Self-serving – helps only when not inconvenienced)	

**Success Habits**

OBEDIENT	<b>Does what he/she is told to do quickly and willingly –1 Sam. 15:22b</b> (Disobedient – obeys grudgingly, is rebellious)	
ORDERLY	<b>Takes care of his/her things and is neat – 1 Cor. 14:40</b> (Disorganized – confusion, things are always getting lost, messy)	
HONEST	<b>Has truthful words and truthful ways – Col. 3:9</b> (Lies – is not truthful in words and/or actions)	

**Task Orientation**

SELF-CONTROL	<b>Will do something, even when he/she doesn't feel like it – Prov. 25:28</b> (Self-indulgence – does "their own thing," put his/her desires first)	
INITIATIVE	<b>Sees what needs to be done and does it – Prov. 6:6-8</b> (Hesitant – waits for others to take the lead)	
ATTENTIVE	<b>Listens with eyes, ears, and heart – Prov. 4:20-23</b> (Insensitive – doesn't pay attention, ignores people)	
DILIGENT	<b>Works hard to accomplish a task – Col. 3:23-24, 2 Tim. 2:15</b> (Slothfulness – doesn't care how well tasks are done)	
COMMITTED	<b>Stays with a task until it is successfully done – Titus 3:8</b> (Fickle – changes tasks often without completing any well, not persistent)	
RELIABLE	<b>Is trustworthy – 1 Cor. 4:2</b> (Undependable – can't count on him/her, even when he/she promises; may or may not do it)	
RESPONSIBLE	<b>Does what he/she knows he should do without constant reminding – 1Cor. 4:2, Luke 16:10a</b> (Irresponsible – has to be "nagged" to get tasks done)	
CREATIVE	<b>Does things a new way – Gen. 1:31</b> (Uncreative – gets into a rut, does not try new ways, prefers status-quo)
